

Voyage's happy end

AT long last the volume of essays on Stevenson, commissioned by the Club to mark its Centenary last year, is ready to go to the printers.

Fortunate Voyager features contributions by friends of Stevenson from all walks of life, telling how he has inspired their work and has enriched their lives.

The title comes from a Stevenson quotation: 'We are all travellers in the wilderness of this world, and the best that we find is an honest friend. He is a fortunate voyager who finds many.'

The 60 contributors to the book each give their personal view of one of Scotland's greatest writers and one of literature's most charismatic personalities, showing how Stevenson remains a living force in the 21st century.

Contributors range from best-selling authors such as Ian Rankin, Val

McDiarmid and Michael Handson Morpurgo, to eminent academics, politicians and pop royalty in the shape of Sir Paul McCartney.

The book's voyage from the initial idea to the present handsome volume has been fraught with difficulties, not least of which being the Coronavirus pandemic, which led to the original publisher pulling out of the project as it had to scale back its list.

But this setback turned out to be an opportunity for the Club to further interest in the life and works of RLS by working closely with Publishing students at Edin-

burgh Napier University. Working with the students and staff led by Professor Avril Gray to publish the book under the university's Merchiston Press imprint has been a pleasure, as they have shown great skill, commitment and enthusiasm for the project.

A Pilgrimage to Swanston

Thenadays it was customary for Rosaline Masson (daughter of the Professor of English at Edinburgh University and sister of Louis's friend Flora Masson) to give an address in the school-house at Swanson about Stevenson and the location.

Louis would walk out to Swanston frequently from the centre of Edinburgh and would roam the Pentland Hills, either alone or in the company of the 'Roaring Shepherd' John Tod.

The 'Hills of Home' inspired his writing, including poems such as Ille Terrarum and A Mile And A Bittock, while Swanston Cottage features in
