Competition Instructions

1. Candidates should submit one piece of writing from one of the following categories:

Fiction, Reflective Writing, Poetry

2. The piece submitted should be directly inspired by Stevenson's writing or some aspect of his life. Candidates should write a brief paragraph describing this stimulus and how it has influenced them to write.

3. Prose items should be no more than 1500 words, poetry no more than 40 lines.

We encourage entries written in Scots or in English.

Creative writing produced for SQA folio work may be submitted.

Aims of the competition

1. To increase awareness and deepen interest in the life and works of Robert Louis Stevenson among senior pupils in Scotland's secondary schools.

2. To support the ongoing development of pupils' creative writing skills in which schools are already engaged, especially for folio work written towards national assessment.

Prizes for the competition

The entries will be judged by acclaimed author Louise Welsh, who will also lead a writing masterclass for the best entrants, with up to twelve places on offer. All those selected will receive a certificate and a year's free membership of the Edinburgh Robert Louis Stevenson Club.

In addition, four individual awards of £100 are available for Fiction, Reflective Writing, Poetry and Writing in Scots (in any of these three forms). There will also be a trophy for the overall
